#### JAPAN EVANGELICAL CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

The fall semester of the Japan Evangelical Christian School opens on Monday, September 8, at Higashi Kurume. Plans are underway to add the ninth grade this fall. Tuition for children of members of the school association is eighteen thousand yen per child per semester. (Membership in the association is open to Evangelical missionaries who subscribe to the statement of faith). For all others the tuition is ¥27,000 per semester. A boarding school in charge of Rev. and Mrs. Sydney Best is in operation on the school property. Charges for children in the boarding school are ¥360 per day. Pleasetwrite jumediately to Rev. Best for information and for applications to enroll your child for the Fall Term. A School Board meeting on August 4 will consider all applications received up to that date.

#### NEW REGISTRATIONS

We are informed that previously established Shukyo Hojin (Religious Juridical Persons) have until October 2, 1952, to submit applications for establishing themselves under the new law. For those Mission Groups interested, write to Mr. Sorley for a copy of the new law in English, as printed by the Religious Affairs Section—Ministry of Education.

Missionaries are required to file new registration with the Japanese Foreign Office before July 31, 1952. The Tokyo office is located near the corner of 10 th and "A".
