

PRAYER FELLOWSHIP ANNIVERSARY

The Revival Prayer Fellowship in Tokyo recently completed its second full year of weekly early morning prayer meetings. Springing from the vision of missionaries who believe that prayer is primary and not secondary, these gatherings have continued as times of unusual fellowship and blessing to many-and in ever increasing measure.

Uniting as it does members of many denominations and many nationalities, this Prayer Fellowship has been a striking example of oneness in the Body of Christ. Baptists and Presbyterians, Lutherans and Methodists, Pentecostals and Holiness men-all have joined together in a common cry to God for a spiritual awakening in Japan. Representatives from Europe and America, from Asia and Africa, from Australia and the islands of the sea - all have found rich spiritual fellowship, and have been united in making intercession for the dire spiritual needs of Japan.

From its outset, the heart-cry of this prayer meeting has been for Revival. Earnest prayers have been made for spiritual quickening both among missionaries and Japanese pastors, and for lost souls. Eternity alone will reveal all the power and blessing which has flowed from these meetings. Located, interestingly, directly between the Emperor's Palace and the Diet building, the final reckoning will undoubtedly show that this band of God-fearing men and women exerted more influence for good in Japan than either of these adjacent institutions.

These payer meetings were begun in the Teito Hotel, but soon expanded beyond the limit of facilities there and were moved to Tokyo Chapel Center, where they have continued up to the present. Several outstanding men of God have spoken at these meetings, among them Dr. Bob Pierce, Rev. Armin Gesswein, Dr. Robt. Munger, Gen. Wm. K. Harrison, Dr. Bob Cook and Dr. Percy Crawford. Joe R. Gooden has been, from the beginning, the leader of this Prayer Fellowship, along with such others as David Morken, Sam Wolgemuth and R.S. Nicholson.

gatherings have been the scene of great heart-searching and renewed dedication to God. Once, the meeting continued without interruption for almost twelve hours, as God displaced defeat with victory and sorrow with rejoicing in the hearts of many who were present.

At 6 o'clock each Thursday morning, the prayer hour is opened with the reading of a portion of Scripture. After an hour of united praying, breakfast is served, and the speaker delivers his message around the breakfast table. Usually the meetings are dismissed by 8:30.

It has been felt that this Prayer Fellowship ought to be duplicated in many other centers throughout Japan. Wherever opportunity presents itself, it is hoped that missionaries (as well as Japanese) will get together to pray for Revival in this land. In this-and in this only-lies real hope for the nation.

There is an unseen world peopled by intelligent, conscious beings, organized to resist the spread of the gospel. They are poised to oppose all who will dare to obey the directive of the Lord Jesus

Christ. We have heard many definitions of the victorious Christian life, but I want to suggest to you that the only victorious Christian is the successful wrestler. All wrestle.....says Paul..... against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. The Christian who, because of his obedience to all the will of God, is overcoming the enemy, primarily upon his knees, is the only victorious Christian.

AND GOD ANSWERED

Fifty years ago, a group of men (John Hyde among them) prayed for a spiritual awakening in India—and God answered their prayer. They adopted a list of principles, in the form of five questions:

1. Are you praying for quickening in your own life, in the life of your fellow workers, and in the Church?

2. Are you longing for greater power of the Holy Spirit in your own life and work, and are you convinced that you cannot go on without this power?

4. Do you believe that prayer is the great means for securing this spiritual awakening ?

5. Will you set apart one-half hour each day as soon after noon as possible to pray for this awakening, and are you willing to pray *till the awakening comes*?

Herein lie some of the secrets, too, for a spiritual awakening in Japan.

Ought we not to pray especially for the Missionary Conferences to be held this summer? Prayer is requested for the E.M.A.J. Conference (July 28 to August 1) and the Deeper Life Conference (August 2 to 8), as well as for the many Mission Conferences which will be held.

THE MIRACLE OF CHRISTIANITY

According to Paul, the secret of Christianity disagrees with humanly accepted formulas, such as, "1 am the consequence of a solemn determination," "I am the product of a real home," or "I am the result of a sys-tem of teaching." Three facts are set forth : "I am crucified with Christ Christ liveth in me.....the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God." The miracle of what Christians are finds its cause in a person-identification with a person—and that Person being Jesus Christ. The Apostle indicates a threefold interlacing of the Christian's life with Jesus Christ's Person as the explanation of the miracle of Christianity.


1. Union with Christ's death provides release. "I am crucified with

Christ."

2. Union with Christ supplies new life. A new thing has sprung up in me, explains Paul. Christ is alive in me; Christ's life is in me. Now, a new life with new and blessed characteristics, desires, and interests has taken possession.

3. Union with Christ inspires a new principle of life. The true Christian's approach to life's problems and needs is a simple, real, conscious rest and dependence on Christ Jesus.

True Christianity is a miracle from beginning to end. It involves the miraculous manifestation of the crucified and risen Christ in the lives of men. Anything called Christianity which falls short of this must be classed as sham and pretense. Notwithstanding, all the marvels that real Christianity includes are extended freely to all men, and no one anywhere need live without them.



GENERAL HARRISON LEAVES JAPAN

Yokosuka, E/P.....Lt. Gen. William K. Harrison, speaking at the Officers Christian Union (of which he is International president) said in a farewell message, "Christian officers should be the best officers they can... and always ready to give a reason to anyone that asks them for the hope that is in them." Harrison assumes his new assignment as commander of US forces in the Caribbean.

EVANGELICAL UNITY IN JAPAN

Kyoto, E/P Thirty Nordic pentecostal missionaries from Finland. Sweden, Denmark and Norway gathered for Bible study, discussions and prayer at their first conference in Japan. They were not only united in spirit, but being able to understand each other's mother tongue they were able to discuss intimate missionary problems freely. J.W. Rudolph reports the conference next year will be given a wider, international character. From the KOBE area, Eddie Karnes reports over fifty missionaries attended the Spring rally of the Evangelical Missionaries Association of Japan recently. Eric Gosden, Kaneo Oda, Joe Gooden and Lon Fulton were the featured speakers. From the chilly Tohoku (N. Honshu) district comes news that evangelical missionaries from 6 societies representing ninety workers met, in AKITA City to discuss comity plans and inter-mission cooperation

there. Raymond Creer presided over the meetings which plan to meet at least once a year. The 1954 chairman is George Huttenlock and Paul Blikstad the secretary.

Comment: While many other similiar meetings are held without being reported, they are a true sign of solid spiritual unity among the 1,700 evangelical missionaries of Japan. The EMAJ is happy to serve as a clearing house for cooperative ventures in Japan.

REVIVAL IN BRITAIN

London, E/P.....Billy Graham said his 3 month crusade was "The most successful ever" and there was much evidence that "Britain was on the verge of the greatest religious awakening in its history." In a BBC broadcast monitered in Tokyo, it was announced that 120,000 people (a new record) were at the final farewell meeting, with 70,000 others at the afternoon rally. Almost 2 million people heard him with about 30,000 decisions during the crusade. Graham said, "Interest was much greater than when we came" to Britain and "If we had a building seating 25,000, it would have been filled every night." Though he is reported to be overexhausted and weak, he is going ahead with his crusade to the European continent.

THE KEY TO SUCCESS Norman P. Grubb


All believers say in a general way "God is Almighty", "God can do this or that". Only one in a thousand says, "God is almighty in me" and "God will do so and so through me". Here lay the essence of Moses' controversy with God at the burning bush. God was saying, "Come now, I will send thee, and thou wilt deliver My people." Moses was replying, "I believe You can and will do it, but not through me". God's almightiness was not the point in question. It was Moses' appropriation and obedience of faith that hung in the balance. Thus when Moses did set forth to carry out the commission, the Holy Spirit rightly says it was done "by faith".

If we trace our weakness in the exercise of authoritative faith to the source, we shall find that our spiritual vitality is sapped at the roots through failure to take a bold grasp of the truth of "Christ in you", sufficient to shatter the illusion and consequent weakening effects of a false sense of separation. We know God only at a distance. We know touches of His power and grace, visitations which come and go. We are sure about the past through trust in His atoning work, and of the future through the promise of eternal life. But we have only a variable consciousness of His daily presence with us.

The transforming truth is that of our inward fusion with Him. "He that is joined to the Lord is one spirit." Can anything describe actual union more realistically than that? We *have* His mind. We *have* His power. If all power is in Him, all power is in us. This was the transforming revelation to the men of faith of old.

Armed with this realization, having pressed through by death and resurrection to an almost unconscious abiding in Christ, so natural does it become, we begin to live secretly with God in an invisible world, whose resources become more real to us than the visible. Indeed, we see that the visible is only a local, temporal manifestation of the invisible, ' 'The visible is made out of the invisible" (Heb. 11:3; Moffatt) and that therefore we are dwelling at the Centre and Source of all things, whereas the Christian to whom the material is still the more real, dwells mainly on the circumference.

4300 PROTESTANT WORKERS

The complete "Japan Harvest" survey of Protestant pastors and missionaries throughout Japan reveals much interesting and vital information.

Of particular interest are the facts regarding Japanese pastors. According to this survey, there are now over 2400 pastors (including unordained workers) of whom approximately half are related to the Nihon Kirisuto Kyodan (United Church). An additional 370 are Episcopalian.

The remaining 970 pastors are either independent or are related to one of about 70 small denominational groups. Although specific information is lacking in many cases, it appears that the majority of these men could be classed as evangelical in doctrine and practice. A large percentage of them are associated with what are commonly called "Holiness" groups.

This information has been gleaned from the 1954 "Kirisutokyo Nenkan", and is based on direct correspondence with all the Protestant groups in Japan. Additional information has been received from the office of the Inter-Board Committee, and from the May survey of "Japan Harvest." It should be noted that the figures given on Japanese pastors includes very little of the fruits of post-war evangelical missionary work. Most of these efforts are still so young as to make successful tabulation virtually impossible.

Neglected Areas

This survey again points up several areas as being woefully lacking in a Protestant witness of any kind while other areas have a disproportionately large number of pastors and missionaries. Tokyo, for instance, has one Protestant worker to every 6400 people, while Saga Ken, Gifu Ken and Toyama Ken have only one worker to every 60,000 or more people. The nation-wide average is one Protestant pastor or missionary to every 20,000 people.

The five most poorly-manned prefectures are Saga (1:81,000), Gifu (1:63,000), Toyama (1:60,000), Kagoshima (1:52,000), and Akita (1:52,000). The five most well-worked prefectures are Tokyo (1:6400), Hyogo (1:10,500), Kanagawa (1:12,000), Nagano (1:12,000), and Kyoto (1:14,000). It should be remembered that these figures include some who are not sound in doctrine, and therefore cannot be considered as adequately evangelizing their areas. However, the complete information is given to present the overall picture as clearly as possible. (continued on page 7)

It is interesting (and challenging !) to note that immediately adjacent to some well-staffed areas are several sections with wholly inadequate Gospel witness. For instance, while Tokyo and Hyogo Ken head the list of well-churched areas, within their borders are two very needy sections — northwest Tokyo, and northern Hyogo (along the Japan Sea).

In prayerfully considering these 4300 Protestant workers scattered throughout the country, we cannot help but exclaim, "We have the fuel — but where is the fire?" Where are the men aflame with a holy passion for souls? Where are those who "turn the world upside down" by their Spirit-anointed lives? Where are the "fearless band", the overcomers, who have learned to do battle with the enemy of souls — even in difficult places? Could it be that our "sacrifice" is not yet "on the altar" — where the fire falls? "Japan Harvest" presents this survey with the hope that it will serve as fuel for fervent, well-directed praying, and also that it will stimulate local study of particular areas, as a basis for effective cooperation and effective evangelistic efforts—especially in neglected areas. It is sent out with full appreciation of the inadequacy of such figures to truly represent all phases of the problems involved — and yet with the assurance that it provides a much fuller view of Gospel work in Japan than would otherwise be available to most.

Japan-o-gram (continued from page 3) blast and geiger-counter fever, the evangelical missionaries were busy in tent-meetings, special spring evangelistic efforts and Bible Camp plans. Considering the situation in other far east fields, they had reason to rejoice at the still open door. From New Delhi, India, word came that two American Baptist missionaries, working in Assam State since 1951 were refused permission to remain in India. An Indian spokes-man said that it was Government policy not to permit "additional" missionaries to remain in India. From Jakarta, Indonesia came word that Moslem fanatics are killing Christians, burning churches and slaughtering thousands of pigs in a brutal "Islamization" drive in the Celebes. According to A.P. reports, a whole community of 6,500 Christians were forcibly Islamized by followers of the fanatical Darul Islam movement, killing Christian leaders and forcing Christian women to marry Moslems. Thousands of Bibles were burned or their pages used for cigaret paper while scores of village churches were burned, closed or turned into mosques. From Seoul, Korea, Hwang Kum Chun, Assembly chairman of Evangelism of the Presbyterian Church announced on the 70 th

anniversary of missionary activity "There are over 3,000 churches embracing 700,000 people here. We look upon it as our duty to win all the people of Korea to Christ and so we unanimously voted for the 5 year plan of Evangelism in this 39 th assembly." Meanwhile Robert Rice reports "Korea is fast coming back to normal living and the fields were never whiter for harvest. There is a prayer mountain where at least 100 persons are praying day and night and at times over 1,000 gather. There is a desire to build a prayer retreat on "The Foremost Mountain called House of prayer." Stressing prayer as Korea's greatest need, Rice states that they have "Received physical goods in abundance, so much that any authority dealing with relief agrees that nearly half the relief poured into Korea for free distribution has found it's way to the open market where it is sold for profit." Another mission leader returning to Japan from Korea said, "Evangelism's open door in Korea today exceeds that of Japan's after the war." From, Singapore comes word that the Overseas Missionary Fellowship of the C.I.M. sheld a successful missionary conference regarding it's Far East missionary responsibilities. Meanwhile, the future of missionary activity in the threatened French Indo China area awaited the final outcome of the Geneva Conference.

REACHING SERVICEMEN FOR CHRIST

Kobe, E/P.....Chaplain Vern Slater of the Kobe R & R Center holds meetings on Monday and Friday night at the Kobe Union Church. A varied program consisting of devotionals, Christian Films, musicales, games and refreshments has reached over 4,000 servicemen in four months. Dr. W.C. McLauchlin, past chairman of the 6th World Congress on Evangelism was recently elected as pastor of the Kobe Union Church. At the Christian Servicemen's center in YO-KOSUKA, Lt. JG. Marvin McKissick reports a deeply inspirational time was had at their annual Servicemen's Bible Conference held there recently. Donald E. Hoke and Major Jack King spoke. Director Byron Ryals expresses thanks for all the missionaries who have helped out as hosts and hostesses, but reports many more are needed. Volunteers should contact R.S. Nicholson. 

For these programs, Dr. Brumbaugh on a recent stay in Japan under the N.C.C. said, "American Churches have finally become aware of the serious moral problems around military bases in Japan and would soon be sending support...to give servicemen as alternative to the present degrading entertainment facilities."

Comment: The conservative servicemen centers and Gospel Hours have proved that the plain Gospel of Christ is still the best 'Alternative' for "our boys."

NEW EVANGELICAL BOOKS

Sendai, E/P.....The publishers of Halley's Bible Handbook announced it's second major book publication, the New Testament Introduction by Henry C. Thiessen. One of the best evangelical general introductions on the N.T. the 400 page volume will be of particular value in Japan where basic studies are so influenced by liberal teaching. The Japan Conservative Baptist missionaries feel its nondenominational character which sharply opposes sub-Christian views of the N.T., the "Q" document theory and the primacy of Mark will be a big boon to every serious-minded student, pastor, layman and teacher. Meanwhile in TOKYO, Fred Jarvis said, concerning the new publication of David Brainerd's Diary "This classic biography has stirred the hearts of men of God for years as an example of revival. I'm sure it will have a tremendous impact on the Japanese Christians." This is another one of Oswald J. Smith's books which have been translated into 19 languages and Braille.

On the secular book front it appears that an U.S. economy measure is giving the Communists an opening in Japan. With American Overseas libraries closing their doors because of budget cuts, Russian and Chinese Communists are moving into the vacuum with dirt-cheap, but highgrade English books. The Russians are now the leading producers of foreign books sold in Japan and offer the struggling student a whole library of Marxist English books for \$5.00 and an armload of current magazines for \$1.75. A Japanese commentator bitterly sums it up this way, "The U.S. offers 150 million dollars to help us rearm, but closes down libraries to save \$100,000. What kind of culture is this?"

Question: Will once again, the wreath "Too little and too late" have to be hung over protestant evangelicals who have yet to crash the secular popular markets with either magazines or books setting forth the old, old story in a new way.

WORLD CONGRESS RESULTS CONTINUE

Tokyo, E/P...Japan Youth for Christ-Navigators follow-up director, George Bostrom reports that 4,126 seekers who made decisions during the world congress have attended church, according to reports received from pastors. A letter was sent out to 768 pastors, giving names and addresses of "seekers" who either chose their church or were assigned to them, asking the pastors to check on each person and send a report back to the YFC office. Reports were received from 367 pastors.

An overall average shows close to 20 % of the students have finished the first lesson. A major emphasis in the correspondence follow-up program is geared to getting the study-ing "Seekers" to witness. Already 10,000 lessons have been sent out as a direct result of this witnessing.
